'Mother Earth, Mother Nature'

Through the school's topic 'Mother Earth, Mother Nature' we will build on the strong foundations set in the Autumn term. This theme will inspire many of the activities that will engage the children's learning and spark their curiosity.

After reading the story 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers the children will create their own books about what makes them happy.

In the second half of the term we will have an exciting visit from a petting farm. Leading on from this the children will investigate and learn about animals from all around the world from a variety of different habitats.

In parallel, we will explore various well known and familiar stories about animals such as 'The Little Red Hen', 'The Ugly Duckling', 'The Three Little Pigs' and 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff', amongst others. The children will be encouraged to retell these stories through actions, using key vocabulary and they will begin to learn about story structure.

Homework

Thank you to all Parents and Carers for continuing to support your child's homework, it is really important for their ongoing progression. Reading books will be changed every week so please continue to return both reading records and directed tasks. As the children learn new sounds it is important that they begin to recognise these sounds at the beginning and within words. A good way to support this is to play I spy and play the online game 'teach your monster to read'.
