The percentage of children entitled to Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) has declined overall in recent years from 32% in 2015 to 25.2%% in 2019-20 (Year 1-6). Across the school, the amount of children entitled to the grant varies with less Disadvantaged children in the Early Years and Key Stage 1. In Yr 6 around 50% of children are entitled to the Pupil Premium Grant. The majority of children who attend Albemarle are Pakistani (21%), White British (16%) and from any other Asian background (11%). According to the Ofsted IDSR, Albemarle is in the top 20% of schools for the proportion of EAL pupils and 33% of all PPG pupils currently on roll are EAL.

School Development Plan Objectives:

To raise (attainment and) standards in writing in Key Stage 1 (and 2) by ensuring pupils continue to build on the good start made in the Early Years Foundation Stage (OFSTED priority from 2009 Full Inspection) (including Pupil Premium)

To raise the attainment in Reading through implementing a 'deep dive' approach across the curriculum

To further review the curriculum and embed curious and creative learning opportunities across all aspects of school life

To further enhance the provision (through a sensory approach) and close the gap in attainment between **Disadvantaged** children, those with SEND and their peers

To extend the wider curriculum (including extra-curricular activities) to enhance personal development across all key stages

To enrich school improvement through working in collaboration with educational settings, other professionals and the LA

Barriers to Future Attainment.

The barriers and challenges faced by our disadvantaged pupils at Albemarle are varied and very much dependent on the circumstances of each individual child. At Albemarle, we quickly identify strategies which can be implemented for individual children so that they are able to thrive and reach their full potential.

- A. English as an Additional Language Albemarle is in the top 20% of schools for the proportion of EAL pupils (53.6%) and 33% of our PPG pupils are EAL.
- B. Pupil Mobility in 2018/19 around 65% of pupils in Year 6 had started at the school in Early Years with many children starting at the school later on in their school careers. This provides less time to assess children's knowledge and to implement strategies and further support that can close potential gaps in their knowledge and understanding. Currently, 63% of Year 6 pupils and 66% of Year 5 pupils started Albemarle in the Early Years.
- **C. Individual Circumstances** Historically, PPG children are more likely to experience challenges around self-confidence and mind-set.
- **D.** Attendance & Punctuality Last year attendance amongst PPG pupils was below expectations at 94.01% leading to gaps in knowledge and understanding. Persistent Absentees are also statistically more likely to be among PPG pupils.
- **E. Home Learning –** PPG children are statistically more likely to have less exposure to high level vocabulary and support with homework, which leads to gaps particularly in Reading & Writing.
